Tour Broadway Homes on May 16

Broadway's Tour of Homes will be held on **Sunday, May 16**. The Tour of Homes, entitled "*Come Back to Life in Broadway*," has traditionally been held on Mother's Day. Although the date has changed, many of the featured activities will remain the same. Visitors who attend the tour will receive a survey to complete so that the committee can determine if the date change should be permanent.



Once again the homes featured this year will highlight the bond of modern family life with historic architecture and interiors. New construction in the neighborhood will be an addition to the tour this year.

Featured homes include:

- 1046 17th Street, owned by Jason and Lori Wheeler
- 1036 21st Street, owned by Ken and Amy Bratsch
- 1209 21st Street, owned by Rita Pillard
- 944 22nd Street, owned by Jeff Ignatius and Pam Kennerly
- and as a bonus, 1600 20th Street, the Parish House at First Lutheran Church.

Actors portraying the homes' original owners will greet visitors at the door of each home. And this year, two historic trolleys will transport guests around the neighborhood with a narrated tour of the [Broadway Historic District](#).

The lot at 20th Street and 8th Avenue will once again be transformed into "Broadway Square" and will feature refreshments such as grilled pork chop sandwiches and fresh lemonade and a cake walk.

The Tour of Homes is from **11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, May 16th**. Admission on the day of the tour is \$10 donation per person. Children 12 and under are free when accompanied by an adult. Proceeds from the event will benefit the Broadway Historic District Association, a not-for-profit organization, dedicated to educating visitors and residents about the history and architecture of the neighborhood.
