



Dear Coaches, Players, & Spectators:

The Rock Island Park Board welcomes you to our facility. On behalf of the City of Rock Island we would like to thank you for coming out to our facility. Please take note to a couple of rules for our facility.

1. Alcohol may **not** be brought into the facility. We do serve beer and adult malt liquor beverages, but only during adult league or tournament play. We do not serve during sanctioned youth tournaments.
2. Please do not bring food or beverages into the facility or parking lot. If you wish to have a picnic there is a park with a shelter near the entrance of the facility you may use. We have a concession stand with very reasonable prices that includes everything from water to pork chop sandwiches. Water jugs and bottles are more than welcome as long as they are not glass containers.
3. No tent stakes, umbrellas, or portable hitting fences that require ground stakes please. There are irrigation lines that lay just beneath the ground near our ball diamonds. You are more than welcome to set up tents or use umbrellas that do not use stakes. Teams may set up portable hitting fences in our soccer fields.
4. Coaches, please have your players warm-up on the far side of the scoreboards or in the soccer field. We have seen too many players and spectators hit from foul balls or individuals hit by overthrows into the bleaches. This is for you and your players safety. Pre-game warm up on the in-field or outfield is **not** allowed.
5. No pepper or batting practice into the fences even with plastic balls. It is just too hard on the fences and turf.
6. No dogs or pets.
7. Please use the trash barrels and have your team clean out the dugout area so it is clean for the next team.
8. Please obey the signs in the parking lot and use the appropriate spaces marked for parking. This includes parking in front of the maintenance shed, bathroom area, the grass, and emergency lane. If the parking lot is full there is additional parking in the park in front of the facility.
